

Oh, look at the moons filled with the letter m. Let's point to them while we say the "m" sound (point and say the m sound six times).

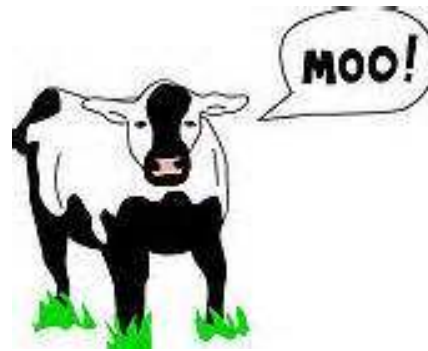
Extra: you can place a nice snack like cheerios, raisins, or an M& M on the each star as an incentive to get your child to repeat the sound.

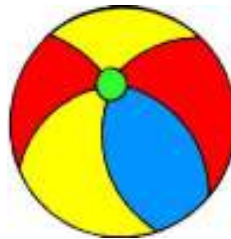
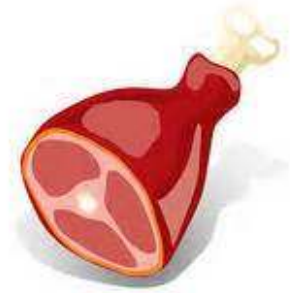

Extra: these represent one syllable sounds which is great for working on words. This pairs the consonant sound m with a long or short vowel. Repeat as often as needed.
